Our annual Symposium on **Sustainable Development** has been continuous since Year 2000, and all the personally delivered papers up to 2018 have been peer-reviewed and published in the respective IIAS books, entitled *Sustainable Development and Global Community (Volumes I ~ XIX)*, edited by Prof. George E. Lasker and Prof. Kensei Hiwaki.

We adhere to the definition of Sustainable Development in *Our Common Future* (1978) to avoid unnecessary definitional complications: “Sustainable Development is the development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.” This definition was reinforced by the **2002 World Summit**: “Sustainable Development is built on three interdependent and mutually reinforcing pillars – economic development, social development and environmental protection – which must be established at local, national regional and global levels.”
